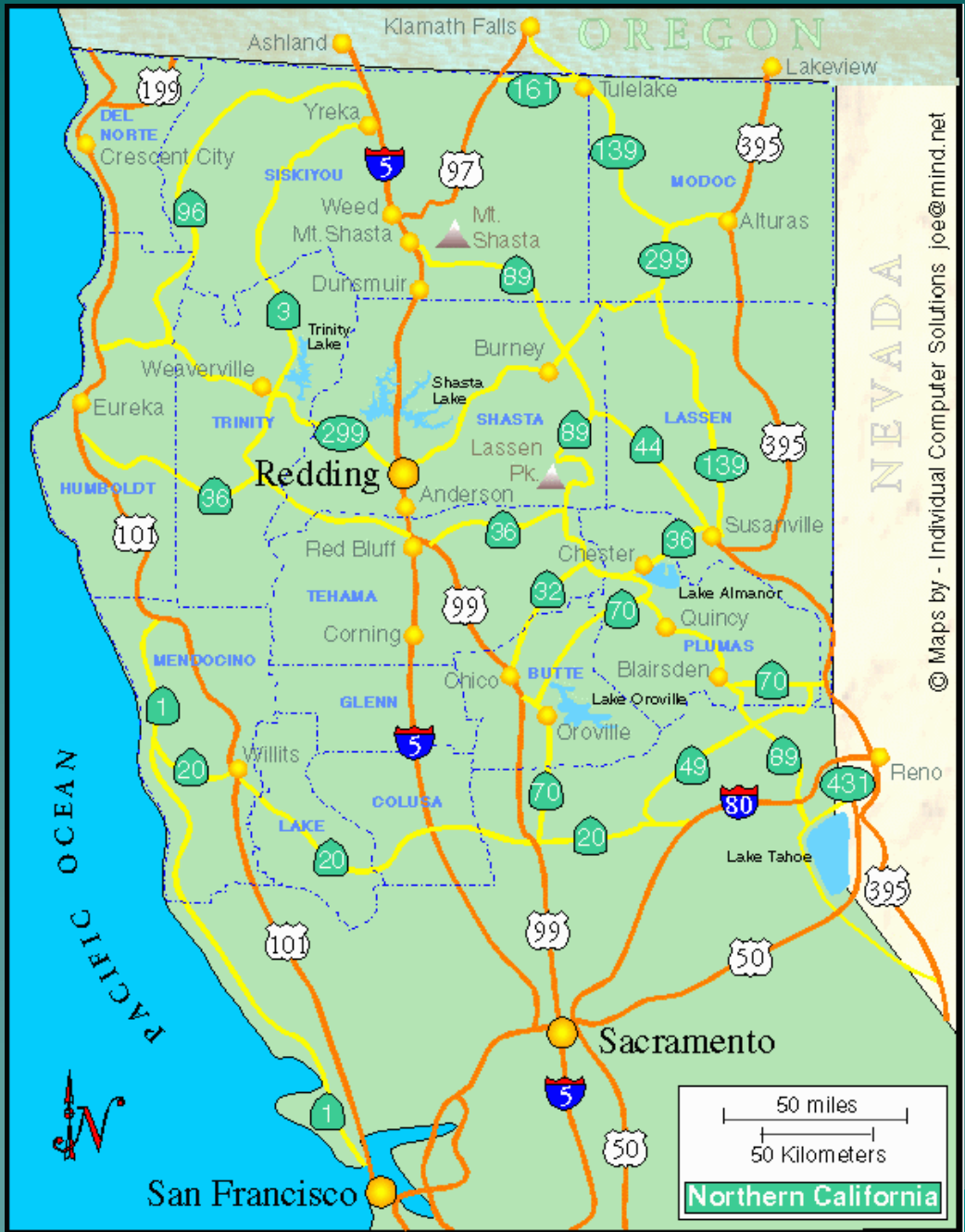


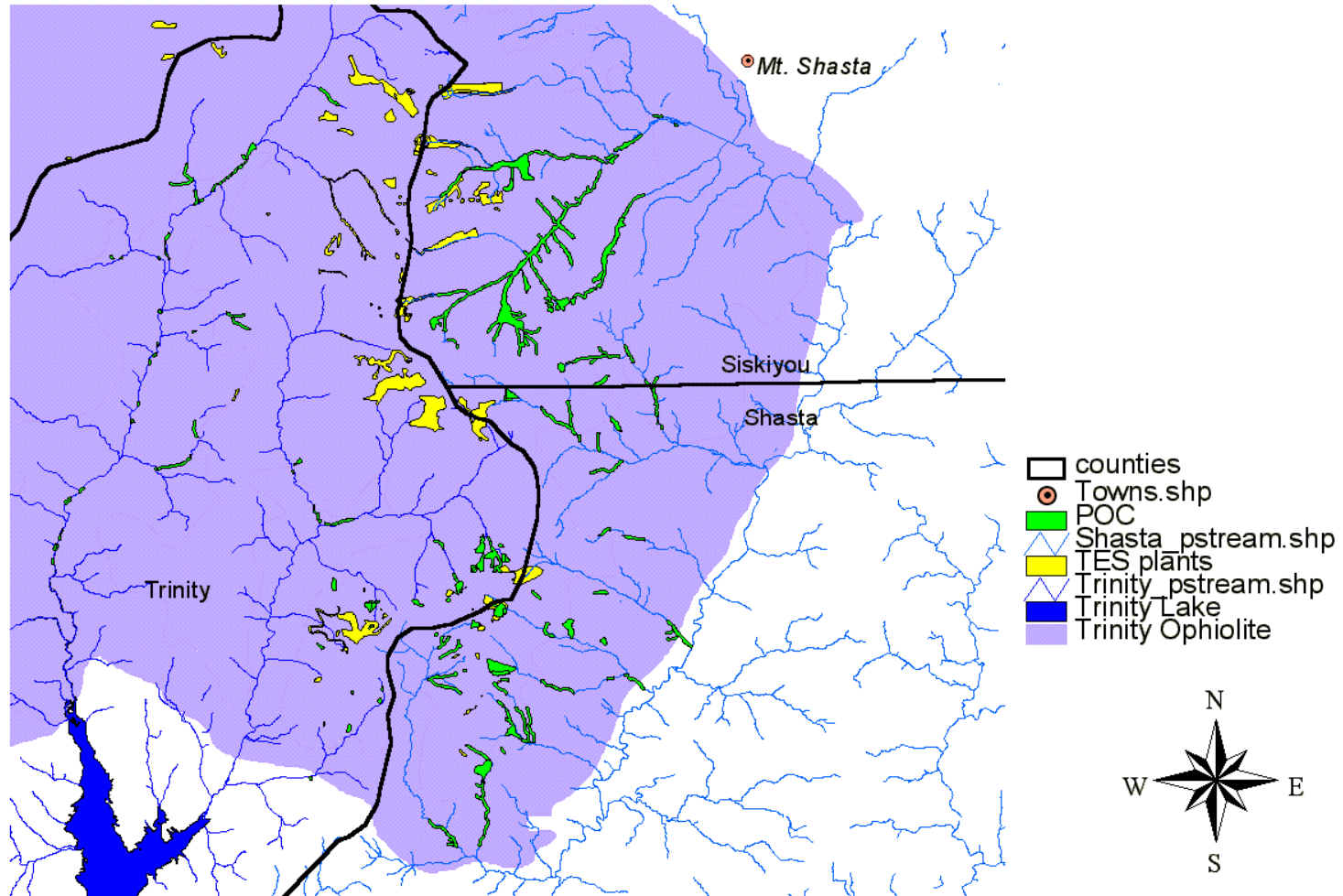

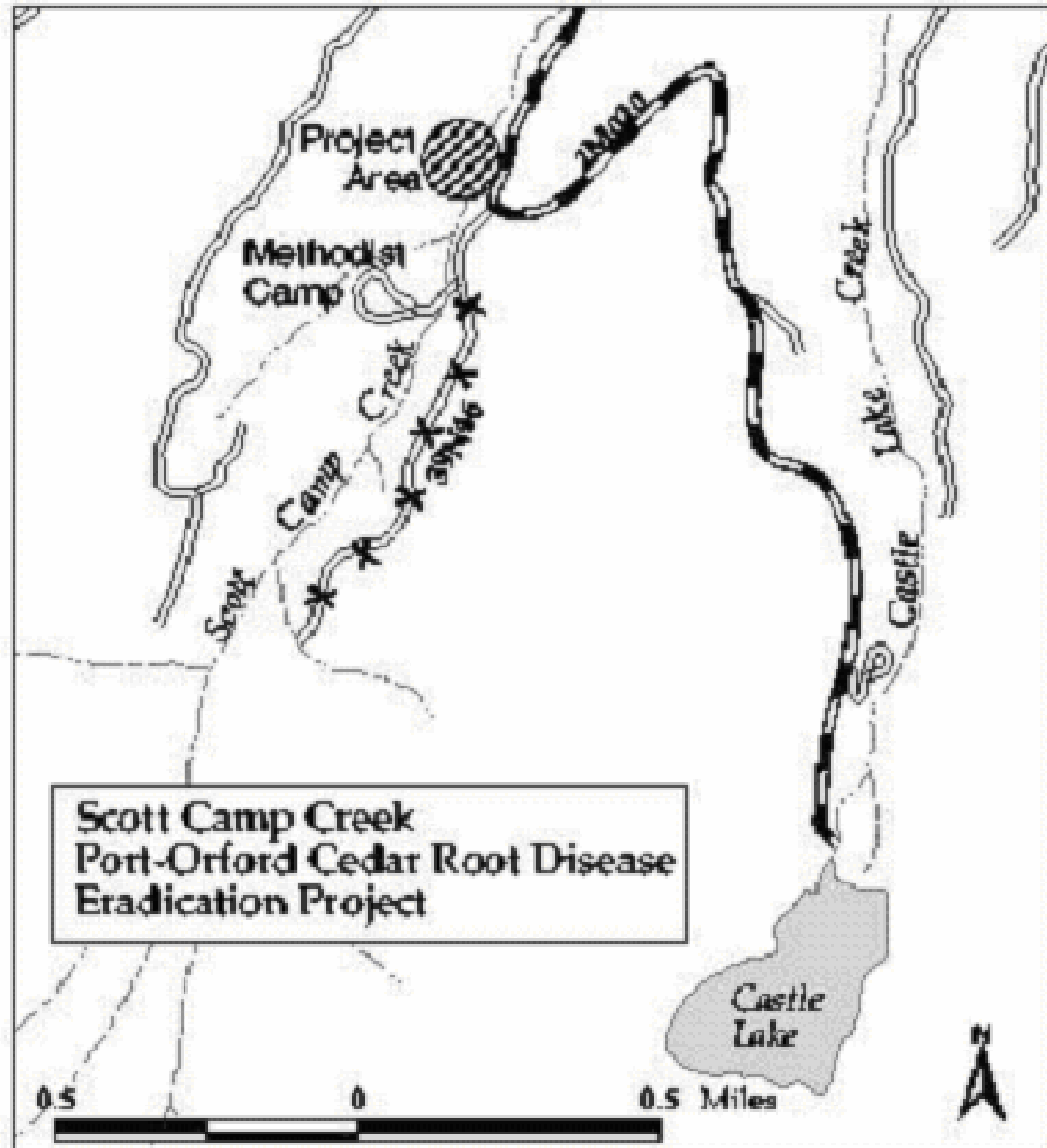

- ◆ Project took from Sept. 2001 through Nov. 2005 to kill all POC trees in area.
- ◆ Will take at least until 2010 to declare area free from disease.
- ◆ Estimated cost of project to date: Over \$10,000, or over \$3,000 per acre.
